Section 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Eye: Flush eyes with large quantities of water for several minutes, holding the eyelids apart. Get medical attention.

Skin contact: Wash skin with soap and water. Seek medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. Seek medical attention if breathing is difficult or irritation develops.
